Biographical Sketch

Allan Demers was born in South Africa and was a member of the OFS Regional Council and the Progressive Party. He moved to Canada ca. the early 1970s, settling in Ocean Falls, B.C., and later at Shawnigan Lake, B.C. In 1977, as Chairman of the Coastal Transport Action Committee, he helped fight for better ferry service to the Ocean Falls/Bella Bella areas of the B.C. Coast. Demers kept in touch with friends in South Africa and created research files relating to racial, cultural and economic issues in South Africa.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of Demers' collection of clippings from South African newspapers re: apartheid; pamphlets, correspondence, notes, brochures and clippings concerning South Africa and related matters; newspapers, magazines and journals published in and/or relating to South Africa, representing black, Jewish and Christian groups.

INTRODUCTION

The records of Allan Demers were acquired by U. Vic. Special Collections in August 1984, and consist of material created or collected by Demers relating to South Africa. These files will therefore be of particular interest to those studying various aspects of South Africa, such as apartheid, the economy, labour, etc.

Researchers may also wish to consult the records of Prof. Reginald Roy which also contains extensive material concerning South Africa, and which complements information found in the Demers papers. An inventory to the Roy *fonds* is available in the University Archives.

Further accruals are unlikely; however, this inventory will be updated as required.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Allan Demers was born in South Africa and was a member of the OFS Regional Council and the Progressive Party. He moved to Canada ca. the early 1970's, settling first in Ocean Falls, B.C. and later in Shawnigan Lake. In 1977, as chairman of the Coastal Transport Action Committee, he fought for improved ferry service to the Ocean Falls/ Bella areas of the B.C. coast.
